LRAG News Update - 27 February 2024

At 10 a.m. this morning The Leader of Surrey County Council held a meeting to formally announce the decisions about progressing with plans for the Burpham to Guildford Active Travel Scheme for the A3100 London Road.

As detailed in last week's newsletter, and also in much of the online media, there had been 4 effective recommendations made, following an extensive period of public engagement. All recommendations were accepted by the Leader and the decisions confirmed. As a reminder, in brief, the decisions were:

1. Proceed with the construction of Section 2 – Boxgrove Roundabout

Detailed design review was envisaged, with pedestrian and cyclist safety in mind, but that the intention was to simplify the existing proposal.

2. Not proceed with Section 3 - Boxgrove Roundabout to York Road

A further review of the possibility of obtaining additional highway space from London Square (opposite Guildford High School) was requested and acknowledged by the Leader.

3. Defer a decision on Section 1 (New Inn Lane to Boxgrove Roundabout)

The timescale for reaching a decision on Section 1 was indicated as being by the summer recess.

The further design review of this section, of the safety of the road width at pinch points and the reliance on extensive shared paths, was likely to be guided by a very recent publication from Active England, called the <u>Route Check User Manual</u>. The Leader acknowledged, and quoted from, this document, which states, as the first of its 6 policies, that pedestrians and cyclists should be separated, and shared space should only be used as a last resort.

4. Commit to progressing with the delivery of a controlled crossing near Winterhill Way, and progress the delivery of a zebra crossing on the junction of Nightingale Road and London Road Page
